Dear brothers and sisters,

New Jersey had its first COVID-19 patient the past Monday and the number has increased since then. The number of confirmed cases increases more rapidly in New York, and the NY governor just declared the state of emergency Saturday (3/7) due to the obvious community spread. CDC expects more cases will be detected across the country. We believe that to implement some precautious measures of prevention will help protect our church members. It is a responsible manner toward the community and also safeguard our church life from unnecessary anxiety and keep the enjoyment of Christ as the focus of our gatherings.

For this purpose, we will implement several practices in our church life temporarily until the potential hazard of COVID-19 significantly diminishes.

- 1. From now on, the Table serving brothers will wear disposable gloves and will cover the Bread and Cup with plastic wrap during prayers before breaking the Bread and serving. After the Bread is broken, it will be dispensed into individual portions to be served to the saints, similar to how the Cup is served.
- 2. Starting from next Lord's Day (3/15), we will temporarily stop our lunch service after meeting. Please arrange your own lunch.
- 3. Use hand sanitizer or wash hands as soon as entering the meeting hall. Avoid handshaking and any other body contacts.
- 4. Cleaning service saints will start using alcohol to sanitize selected areas as part of service.
- 5. If you traveled overseas recently, please follow the US government's guidance. Depending on to the countries you have visited, you may be asked for self-quarantine or health monitor. We will also ask you not to come to any church meetings or related activities and minimize contact with others if in the past 14 days you were in the countries/locations that CDC issued travel alert for. Currently it includes China, Iran, South Korea, Italy, Japan, and Hong Kong. If you have any symptoms of respiratory illness (fever, sore throat, cough, or shortness of breath) during these two weeks, please seek medical assistance immediately.
- 6. Anyone who has any symptoms of respiratory illness, please seek medical assistance immediately, even you have never traveled overseas. Please avoid public places or contacting others until completely recovered.
- 7. In addition, if you have been in close contact with those who recently came from the above high-risk countries/locations or might have contacted with COVID-19 patients, you should stay home and avoid public places for 14 days and until there is no symptom shown for 14 days.

Please continue to pray that the disease can be restricted soon.
