Excerpt from Ministry Reading (The LS of Deuteronomy chapter 18):

The Hanging of a Criminal on a Tree

Deuteronomy 21:22-23 is concerned with the hanging of a criminal on a tree. A criminal could be executed not only by being stoned but also by being hanged on a tree. Whereas Stephen was killed by being stoned (Acts 7:58-59), the Lord Jesus was killed by being crucified, that is, by being hanged on a tree. The one hanged on a tree in Deuteronomy 21:22-23 is therefore a type of the crucified Christ.

If in a man there was a sin, a cause worthy of death, and he was put to death and was hanged on a tree, his corpse was not to remain overnight on the tree but had to be buried on that day, for he who was hanged was accursed of God (vv. 22-23). This was exactly the situation when the Lord Jesus was crucified (John 19:31). He was buried on the day of His crucifixion.

The one who was cursed and hanged on the tree was a type of Christ, who was cursed and hanged on the cross to redeem us out of the curse of the law (Gal. 3:13).

Deuteronomy 21:22-23 is an illustration of an important principle—that the Old Testament was written not mainly for the sake of the children of Israel but mainly for the sake of Christ. The primary purpose of the Old Testament is to portray Christ in various ways. This is the reason that Luke 24:27 says of the Lord Jesus, "Beginning from Moses and from all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself." Furthermore, in opening the minds of His disciples to understand the Scriptures, He said to them, "All the things must be fulfilled which have been written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and Psalms concerning Me" (Luke 24:44). In Deuteronomy 21 we have a type of Christ as the One who was hanged on the tree, on the cross. Peter used the word tree when speaking of the Lord's crucifixion: "Who Himself carried up our sins in His body onto the tree" (1 Pet. 2:24).

Recent Event: 2020 Northeast Spring College Retreat



It is always good to take a break from the stresses of work, school, and life in order to pursue and enjoy the Lord with other believers. Last weekend February 21-23, students from the northeast college campuses gathered for the 2020 spring semester retreat at Incarnation Camp in Ivoryton, Connecticut. These young adults represented five states; Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New Jersey, and New York. There were a total of 10 students from Rutgers University and 5 serving ones who were able to attend the weekend conference. The students saw that from the beginning of the Bible to the end there is a divine stream in which God is flowing out Himself. This divine stream is the unique stream of God's work that issues in the producing and building up of the church as God's house. In addition, a major part of the retreat was to allow the students to spend some personal time with the Lord learning how to dig out blockages that hinder the flow. Saints Sharing Their Enjoyment from the Retreat:

- 1. What I enjoyed the most about the retreat was being able to spend personal time with the Lord each day. It can be so easy to forget about Him at school, so being able to have that time with Him during the retreat and separate from the world felt very special.
- 2. Wherever the divine stream goes, there is the work of God, which is to transform us into precious stones for His building!
- 3. We should give everything to the Lord. Our future, job, marriage, everything. The Lord cares for the sparrows and we have much more value to the Lord than them. He will care for us.
- 4. We all have the same fountain in our spirit. No one has a "stronger" or "weaker" fountain.
- 5. "Millions of people go through college, but only a few come out precious." I enjoyed that our Lord is a man of bronze and he measures us in our circumstances. The water increases from our ankles, our knees, our loins and eventually we are restricted but swimming in this divine flow. Praise the Lord there are waters to swim in! As we stay in the flow and allow Christ to measure us, we become precious for His building.
- 6. A verse that touched me: "For we have brought nothing into the world, because neither can we carry anything out" (1 Timothy 6:7). The way we enter into the world is the way we leave the world, so will I invest in the unseen things? Will I allow the flow to deepen in me? An older sister recommended the divine stream to us for the rest of our lives. She didn't always know if she could feed her kids, keep them warm, but she testified the Lord took care of everything as she chose to be in the flow. Another prayed while in her 20s, "God, if there is really the stream, I want to be in it." Today in her 70s she testifies, "I've been in that flow. I have no regrets." I know that I am not anyone special, not particularly bright, having any streaks of talent or notable skills, but to live in the flow, to keep the flow, to be faithful to the flow - may it be my only plea. The flow is simply God working Himself into man and man being worked into God. At the end of my life, I want to know that I lived a life that counted. For this, I look forward to more of the man of bronze's judging to flow away what is of me and flow in what is of God, so life would increase and be imparted to others for the building of God's house because it's out of the building - a group of built up believers in the divine oneness - that the flow is strong, prevailing, and full. Could I be a part of this? Praise the flowing Triune God!
